Draw your Clef on the Staff.		We read and write music on <u>5 lines and 4 spaces</u> called the Staff . Treble Clef The lines are EGBDF and the spaces are FACE. Bass Clef The lines are GBDFA and the spaces are ACEG.
Draw two barlines to create a measure .		Barlines create "boxes of music" known as measures that help us keep track and stay together while we play our music in time. <i>How much music fits in each box?</i> That's why there is a time signature.
Draw the 4/4 Time Signature.		The 4/4 Time Signature tells us that each measure is full (or whole) when there are 4 quarter notes per measure or anything equal. <i>Therefore, a whole note is equal to the length of 4 quarter notes.</i>
Draw a Whole Note		A whole note is a whole measure of <u>sound</u> . In 4/4 time, a whole note is 4 counts long.
Draw a Whole Rest		A whole rest is a whole measure of <u>silence</u> . In 4/4 time, a whole rest is 4 counts long.
Draw a Breath Mark		Breathe. This may be the only good place to take a breath.
Draw a Half Note		A half note is a half measure of <u>sound</u> . In 4/4 time, a half note is 2 counts long.
Draw a Half Rest		A half rest is a half measure of <u>silence</u> . In 4/4 time, a half rest is 2 counts long.






EXAMPLE #1: This is how we count **Quarter Notes**.
